Instead, he put together items from around the house and farm to build a shoot mechanism with PVC pipe that would deliver the feed directly to the feeder while he maintained a safe distance outside the pen.

In school, Emery often volunteers to help his teachers stuff student folders, hang papers in the hallway, and sort papers. He has also been a two-year member of the Grand Valley Youth Wrestling team.
